Lincoln Preparatory Academy

Summer school runs during the month of June between June 4 and June 28.

Registration for classes begins April 9 and ends May 25, after which a late registration fee will be charged in the amount of \$50 per course. Registration is to take place by completing the last page of this document and returning it along with payment to the Front Desk during office hours. You will receive a confirmation email once your registration has been processed (within three business days).

A separate payment will be held for the textbook deposit in the amount of \$35 per course, returned upon completion of the class provided the textbook has been returned. A \$50 processing fee will be charged for any class registration that is withdrawn. No refunds are available after June 6.

Students enrolled in summer school courses will enter and exit through the East entrance of the school, where drop off and pick up occur. Students will not have access to a locker or to the front office or to the health assistant during summer school. Any medications over and above Tylenol or Ibuprofen should be left with the Summer School Lead, Mrs. Posner.

Students are required to conform to Lincoln Preparatory Academy standards of behavior and dress code outlined in the [Family Handbook](#). Students who attend from other Great Hearts schools may wear the uniform for their school.

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Academic Courses

Most academic courses run for four weeks. Note that students will receive a grade and a weekly evaluation for academic courses. For students attending the course for credit recovery, passing this course can replace a student's failing grade earned during the previous academic school year. See course descriptions further down. All course offerings are dependent upon satisfactory student enrollment.

Elective Courses

Elective courses run for one or two weeks each. Note that students do not receive a grade or a weekly evaluation for elective courses. These classes do not offer credit and have no evaluations, but they do provide enrichment opportunities for students and parents to explore areas of interest. Some elective course offerings in the evening are for parents only. See course descriptions further down. All course offerings are dependent upon satisfactory student enrollment.

Academic Courses, Descriptions and Information

Math Fundamentals: June 4-28, 8am-12pm M-Th \$350

This is a skills-based course designed for incoming sixth graders to strengthen their understanding of mathematical concepts by using numerical analysis to master the operations of addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division using whole numbers, fractions, decimals, percentages, and basic algebraic operations. This course is recommended for incoming sixth grade students and for current sixth grade students by letter of referral.

Pre-Algebra: June 4-28, 8am-12pm \$350

This course is designed to help current seventh grade students work on operations with integers and rational numbers, and move toward symbolic language. Students will learn to solve algebraic equations and will work with unknowns to solve various other problems. This course is recommended for incoming eighth graders who need more help with basic algebra skills before entering our eighth grade Algebra I class and for current seventh grade students by referral letter.

Algebra I: June 4-28, 8am-12pm \$350

This course is designed for students who need to strengthen Algebra I topics in anticipation of our 10th grade Algebra II with Trigonometry class and/or for students new to Great Hearts who have not received credit for Algebra I.

Introduction to Latin: June 4-15, 8am-12pm M-Fr \$200

This course is designed for incoming students who need basic first year Latin grammar skills. It prepares students for seventh grade Latin I and provides coverage of sixth grade Latin material. This class is also set for those interested in brushing up their Latin skills.

Latin I: June 4-28, 8am-12pm, M-Th \$350

This course is designed for students who need first year Latin grammar skills. It will prepare students for Latin II. This class is available to students new to Great Hearts who are entering Latin III in the eighth grade or who have been referred by their previous teacher.

Lit/Comp I: June 4-28, 1-3pm, M-Th \$250

This course is designed for any student entering sixth grade who wishes to prepare for sixth grade Lit/Comp or who has been referred by their 5th grade teacher. This class will focus on areas of analytical reading, writing, and grammar skills.

Lit/Comp II: June 4-28, 1-3pm, M-Th \$250

This course is designed for any student entering seventh grade who wishes to prepare for or any student who had difficulty in or failed sixth grade Lit/Comp. This class will focus on higher levels of reading, writing, and grammar.

Lit/Comp III: June 4-28, 1-3pm, M-Th \$250

This course is designed for any student entering eighth grade who wishes to prepare for or any student who had difficulty in or failed seventh grade Lit/Comp. It is an intensive course designed to help students who require more work on reading, analyzing, and writing essays.



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Elective Courses, *Descriptions and Information*

Student Workshop of Shakespeare: June 4-15, 8am-12pm, M-Fr \$200

This two-week course provides an introduction to William Shakespeare's plays and sonnets. Students focus on a comedy, a tragedy, and a variety of poetry.

Classical Education for the Great Hearts Parent: June 2017 (dates TBD) \$100

This evening class for parents provides an overview of classical, liberal education. Subjects reviewed in seminar discussion will include epic and lyric poetry, history, drama, philosophy, science, art, and rhetoric from ancient Greek and Roman authors. Two-hour seminar classes will be offered in the evening for parents based upon schedule availability.

6th Grade Study Skills: June 4-8, 1-2:30pm, M/W/Fr \$100

This course is designed to teach incoming sixth grade middle school students valuable skills to increase productivity and preparedness, as well as to set goals and balance their academic lives. This class will focus on student life, preparation and procrastination, efficiency, active learning, and test preparation.
